

Tomatoes

Determinate vs. Indeterminate

Determinate = Fruits mature all at once creating a short but heavy harvest. Plants put on little or no growth once fruits set.

Determinate varieties are great for limited space gardens and in containers. They are also great for market gardens and commercial operations since only light staking is necessary. Short stakes or commercial tomato cages will work fine for these varieties.

Indeterminate = Plants produce new growth and blossoms even after fruit set. Fruits continue to grow at different stages throughout a prolonged harvest. Fruit is staggered over the growing season and vines will continue to grow and produce throughout the season.

Indeterminate varieties require additional space to grow and generally don't grow as well in containers. These require heavy staking for best results. Often commercial tomato cages will not support the vigorous growth of these varieties. Use tall, sturdy stakes or homemade rebar cages to support the vines throughout the season.


